Install security patches as soon as you can after you a notified that they are available

Restart your computer at least once a week to be sure that patches and updates are fully installed.





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Be careful about installing software on your computer.

If you get an unexpected notice to approve a software installation, it can be a sign that you have been infected with malware.

If you believe you have been infected, shut down your computer and contact your company's technical support team right away.



- Don't delete security software
- Don't change your security configuration
- Don't work around security controls that are there to protect your computer

As many as 85% of all targeted attacks can be prevented by software updates that embed security patches.



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Don't install peer to peer file sharing software on your computer. Be cautious about free games and applications.

Some games and applications contain malicious software that can infect corporate and vendor systems.
